COOKIE POLICY

What are cookies?

A cookie is a small text file that is stored on your computer or mobile device when you visit a particular website. With cookies, a website remembers your actions and preferences (such as sign-in, language, font size, and other display-related preferences) over time, so you do not have to re-enter them each time you return to the site or browse its various pages.

By visiting krilo.hr, we will ask for your consent in order to use cookies that are not necessary for the operation of our website.

We have divided cookies into:

1. Necessary - necessary for proper operation, the legal basis in relation to their use is a legitimate interest,
2. Functional, analytical, performance cookies - the legal basis for their use is consent,
3. Marketing - the legal basis is consent. And

Before giving consent, we will inform you about the purposes of cookies that belong to a particular category, and you can read about the names and duration in Chapter III. of these Policy.

How do we use cookies?

krilo.hr uses cookies and similar technologies for several purposes, depending on the context or product, including:

- 1) temporary user session-id cookies and/or persistent cookies limited to a few hours in some cases - we use them to store your preferences and settings on your device and to improve your experience. For example, saving your personal preferences in cookies allows you to not have to constantly set your preferences anew. Also, if you opt out of interest-based ads, we store your opt-out choices in a cookie on your device;
- 2) authentication cookies, which are used for authentication services, during the use of the site - we use them to verify your credentials. This cookie allows you to move from page to page without having to log in again on each page. You can also save your login information, so you do not have to log in every time you return to the site;
- 3) user security cookies, which are used to detect misuse of authentication, with limited duration - we use them to process security information that allows us to identify fraud and misuse;
- 4) multimedia cookies, such as flash player cookies, for the duration of the page visit;

5) content loading cookies, during the visit to the page - we use them to remember the information you give us, and we store this information in a cookie so that we can remember this information;

6) persistent customization cookies for the user interface during the visit to the page (or a little longer) - we use these cookies to allow you to give feedback on the website;

7) third-party cookies for social network plug-ins for logged-in social network members - some of our websites include social media cookies, including those that allow users who are logged in to a social network to share content over that network. They allow you to login and register through social network accounts and to share the content of the website to said social networks (e.g., via the "Like" button). The specific impact on your privacy will vary from social network to social network and depends on the privacy settings you choose on those networks. You can find out how to manage these cookies on their website.

In addition to the above cookies, we also use:

1. social media add-on cookies for tracking;

2. Cookies for the development and improvement of products and services (third-party promotional cookies) - we use cookies to collect information about your online activity and identify your interests so that we can show you ads that might interest you most. You may also opt out of receiving interest-based ads that we send to you, as described in our Privacy Policy. We also use cookies to record, for example, how many visitors clicked on an ad and which ads you saw, so that you do not see the same ad more than once.

3. Functional cookies (analytical (statistical) cookies) - we use first and third-party cookies and other identifiers to collect usage and performance data, for example: we can use them to count unique visitors to a website or service and to develop other statistics about the operation of our websites and products or to find out about the commercial performance of our products so that we can improve them (for example, we use cookies to collect data that help distribute workloads). This allows our websites to function.

Meta Platforms collects and processes your personal information when you visit that website and applications, including device information and information about your activity without any additional action on your part. This happens regardless of whether you have a Facebook account and whether you are logged in or not.

KAPETAN LUKA – KRILO cannot fully influence the processing of personal data by third parties.

KAPETAN LUKA – KRILO does not use cookies for any purpose other than that described in our Privacy and Data Protection Policy and as stated in this Cookie Policy.

On top of all that, it is important to note that some videos embedded on our site use a cookie to anonymously collect statistics about how you visited the video page and the specific videos you visited.

Enabling these cookies is not strictly necessary for the website but will provide you with a better browsing experience.

You can delete or block these cookies, but if you do, some features of this website may not work.

Do we use other cookies?

Some of our sites or subpages may use additional and/or different cookies from those previously listed and described.

For example:

- companies we hire to provide services on our behalf, such as website analytics, set cookies when you visit our websites;
- companies that deliver content, such as videos or news or ads on our sites, set their own cookies. These companies use the data they process in accordance with their Data Protection Policies, which may allow these companies to collect and combine information about your activities from multiple websites, applications, or network services;

Details about them will be provided to you as soon as they appear, and at that time we will ask you for your consent, if you have not given it before, so that we can store these cookies as well.

Transfer to third countries

KAPETAN LUKA – KRILO uses the tools and services of companies and social networks that do not operate in the European Union. We are obliged to warn you that third parties such as Google LLC may transfer your personal data to the U.S. where it may become available to U.S. government services, if the data transfer is not compliant with the lawful and secure transfer mechanisms prescribed by the General Data Protection Regulation.

We care about the protection of your data and that is why we use various legal options for the lawful transfer of personal data in our business, which will ensure an even greater level of your protection.

On 10 July 2023, the European Commission adopted a new [adequacy decision](#) under which personal data can be freely transferred from the European Union to companies in the US participating in [the Data Privacy Framework](#).

The adequacy decision is based on Article 45 of the General Data Protection Regulation. The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is a mechanism that ensures the secure and lawful transfer of data to third countries. Companies in the U.S. that wish to participate in the Data Protection Framework must undergo a self-certification process and enrol in [the list of companies](#) that have accessed the Data Privacy Framework.

KAPETAN LUKA – KRILO will use an adequacy decision for the transfer of personal data with service providers that successfully self-certify and access the Data Protection Framework.

KAPETAN LUKA – KRILO will use valid standard contractual clauses pursuant to the General Data Protection Regulation for the transfer of personal data with service providers that do not access the Data Protection Framework.

We will inform you further about any measures taken and will amend our policies after the compliance period has elapsed.

What cookies does Google LLC and its affiliates use?

The website krilo.hr also uses certain Google services (Google Analytics) on the basis of which, through cookies and Google LLC, collects certain personal data (hereinafter: Google).

krilo.hr also uses certain Google services based on which, through cookies, Google LLC also collects certain personal data (hereinafter: Google).

The following is considered under the term Google Services:

- Google applications,
- sites and
- Devices and services like Search, YouTube, and Google Home, platforms like Chrome Browser and Android
- products that are integrated into third-party applications and websites, such as ads and
- embedded Google Maps.

When you sign in and interact with some Google services, such as posting a comment on a video on YouTube, your name and image will appear next to your activities. Google may also display this information in ads, depending on your preferences.

Google may also share certain categories of data publicly with its partners, such as advertisers or developers. Google also allows certain partners to collect data from your browser or device for advertising and measurement purposes through their own cookies or similar technologies.

Google uses cookies for many purposes. For example, to remember your SafeSearch settings, to make the ads you see more relevant to you, to count visitors to a particular page, to help you sign up for certain Google services, to protect your information, or to remember your ad preferences.

Below you can see a list of the types of cookies used by Google and learn how Google and its partners use cookies in advertising.

1. Use of the "Settings" cookie

These cookies allow Google sites to remember information that changes the way a website works or looks, such as your chosen language or area. For example, when it remembers which area you are in, a site may offer local weather or traffic news. These cookies can also help you resize text, font, and other parts of web pages that you can customise.

If the information stored in the settings cookie is lost, the site may lose some of its functionality, but this should not prevent the site from working.

Example:

Most Google users have a settings cookie called "NID" in their browser. The browser sends this cookie with requests to Google sites. The "NID" cookie contains a unique ID that Google uses to store your settings and other information, such as your chosen language (e.g., Croatian), how many search results you want to appear on the page (e.g., 10 or 20), and whether to have Google's safe search filter turned on.

2. Use of "Security" cookies

Google uses security cookies to authenticate users and protect user data from unauthorised parties.

Example:

Google uses the "SID" and "HSID" cookies, which contain digitally signed and encrypted records of the user's Google Account ID and the time of last login. The combination of these two cookies allows Google to block many types of attacks, such as attempts to steal the content of forms you fill out on web pages.

3. Use of "Process" cookies

Process cookies help make the website work and deliver services that the website visitor expects, like navigating around web pages or accessing secure areas of the website. Without these cookies, the website cannot function properly.

Example:

Google uses a cookie called "lbc" that allows Google Docs to open multiple documents in a single browser. Blocking this cookie would prevent Google Docs from working properly.

4. Use of "Advertising" cookies

These categories of cookies help Google make advertising more interesting to users and more valuable to publishers and advertisers. Cookies are typically used to select ads based on their relevance to the user, to improve campaign performance reporting, and to avoid showing the same ads to individual users.

Example:

The NID and SID cookies are used by Google to personalise ads on Google products such as Google search. For example, Google uses these cookies to remember your recent searches, your previous interactions with ads or advertiser search results, and your visits to advertiser sites. The latter allows you to display customised ads on Google.

Google also uses one or more cookies for ads served on the web. One of the major advertising cookies on non-Google sites is called the "IDE" and is stored in browsers under the doubleclick.net domain. Another cookie of the same type is stored under the domain google.com and is called "ANID".

Google also uses DSID, FLC, AID, TAID, and exchange_uid. Other Google products, such as YouTube, may also use these cookies to display more relevant ads.

Sometimes advertising cookies may be placed on the domain of the site you have visited. In the case of advertising served by Google on the entire web, "__gads" or "__gac" cookies may be placed on the domain of the site you are visiting.

Unlike cookies that are set on Google domains, Google cannot read those cookies when you are on sites where they are not set.

Their purpose is to measure interactions with ads in that domain and prevent over-display of the same ads to users.

Google also uses conversion cookies whose main purpose is to help advertisers determine how many times people who click on their ad follow up by buying their products.

5. Use of the "Session Status" cookies

Websites often collect information about how users interact with the site. This may include information about which pages users visit most often and whether they receive error messages from specific pages. These "session status cookies" help Google improve its services to provide users with a better browsing experience.

Blocking or deleting these cookies will not render the site unusable.

These cookies can also be used to anonymously measure the effectiveness of PPC (pay per click) and affiliate advertising.

Example:

A cookie called "recently_watched_video_id_list" is used to help YouTube record which videos a particular browser has recently watched.

6. Use of "Analytics" cookies

Google Analytics is an analytics tool that helps website owners and owners of krilo.hr, as well as applications, to find out how their visitors use the options of their sites and applications. It may use a set of cookies to collect information and report site usage statistics without revealing the identity of individual users to Google. Google Analytics' main cookie is "_ga".

In addition to reporting site usage statistics, Google Analytics can be used, along with some of the advertising cookies described above, to display more relevant ads on Google products (such as Google search) and on the web, and to measure interactions with the ads we display.

Export and delete data collected through cookies using Google services

You can export a copy of your data or delete it from your Google Account at any time.

Optionally, you can export a copy of the content from your Google Account to back up or use on a service outside of Google.

To delete your data, you can:

- Delete content from certain Google services.
- Search for and then delete specific items from your account via the My Activity page.
- Delete certain Google products, including data associated with them.
- Delete your entire Google Account.

Which cookies does Meta Platforms Ireland Ltd. use?

krilo.hr collects, uses, and manages your personal data which are also on the Facebook page of “Kapetan Luka - Krilo” and which are available using the said page.

Meta Platforms uses cookies if you have a Facebook account, if you use Meta Platforms products, including our Facebook page and applications, or if you visit other websites and applications that use Meta Platforms products (including the “like” button or other Meta Platforms technologies).

Do other parties also use cookies associated with Meta Platforms products?

Managing cookies in your browser:

In addition, your browser or device may contain settings that allow you to choose whether cookies are stored in the browser and the ability to delete cookies. For more information about these controls, see the browser or device help.

How can you control cookies?

You can control cookies at any time, which means that you can select a different category of cookies with each visit to krilo.hr or you can delete them. In any case we remind you that you cannot control the necessary cookies, since without them the website cannot function, especially not at the level that all our users (respondents) expect.

As the data controller of the website krilo.hr, we have made this possible for you via a pop-up window.

You can also change your preferences at any time through the settings of the browser you are using.

You can delete all cookies that are already stored on your computer, and most browser settings allow you to block the storage of cookies. If you block cookies, you may need to manually adjust some desired settings each time you visit the website, and certain services and features may not be available.
